In 2021 the construction of our Dharma Citta 2 boarding school was completed. It was a huge project, the largest ever carried out by our association. Its construction had to be spread out over several years, due to the eruption of the Agung volcano, the search for funds and then the pandemic. In 2021, 45 high school students and three middle school students moved in and are now living there.

Despite the pandemic and all its constraints, our teams were able to help the Balinese children in their education and their families in particular by distributing food. Recently, for example, we bought four tons of rice, among other supplies, for the families of our godchildren!

Members of our office in France meet together every month via videoconference to discuss and decide on actions to be taken. Florence, Jean-Luc, Maya and Dwi also meet weekly.

We have motivated and strong teams in Europe and Bali. I have supported this wonderful association for 15 years and my role is to be its conductor. I have the job of managing everything without forgetting that our main goals are the education, health and administration of children while ensuring ANAK's sustainability.

In 2021, many other things happened in the association as well: the construction of the Pacung center, the complete overhaul of our communications tools, the creation of our Instagram page and the reorganization of our accounting and administration departments, thanks to Sylvie, our new Treasurer at ANAK France.

A Word from ANAK Bali



Just like 2020, 2021 was marked by the Covid-19 pandemic around the world, resulting in travel bans, country closures, etc. The tourism ban continued and severely impacted Bali's economy. It was a difficult situation for the middle classes who suffer the most and who have had to take up new professions such as farmer, street vendor, etc. Faced with this situation,

throughout the year we continued to take up new challenges in order to keep on providing the best possible care to the children we support and their families. (Details of our actions are found on pages 5 and 6).

Sustainable Development Goals

Adopted in 2015 by the United Nations, these 17 internationally-recognized goals aim to map the path we must all follow to build a fairer and more prosperous world by 2030. Our association is proud to have helped reach 10 of them through our various programs with children, their families and communities. In this way, we can all participate in the great global development chain working with and for Balinese children.



PROVIDING ASSISTANCE

My name is **Komang** and I am a middle school teacher, a job I had been dreaming of since I was a teenager. I started working with ANAK as a reading teacher at ANAK's center in Pakisan. Since 2010, I have been ANAK's coordinator in Sawan, which is my village. At the center in Sawan, built in 2017, I organize and carry out activities with the children. I also make sure the children are healthy and that their schooling is going well. Among other things, I recruit new children in my village for sponsorship and accompany godparents when they visit their godchildren. In addition, I help organize the monthly distribution or any other planned activities. When I see a child smile and forget the difficulties at home for a moment, it makes me particularly happy to be part of ANAK.



Retired from the textile industry and after my past work at parents' associations, I am continuing my path with ANAK for the children of Bali so they can have a better future and access their right to knowledge. After several trips to Bali, I sponsored a child and this year I joined the office and ANAK's Sponsorship Team to help raise funds so we can carry out projects for all these young people.

For several years I have been lucky enough to be godmother to a little girl in Bali and to have seen the problems of these children. ANAK has been working for 19 years to give these children the chance to be supported during their schooling and education.

This is why, in March 2021, I accepted the position of treasurer. The association needed help with accounting, finance, administration and social management. Due to having gained professional experience over 30 years, I accepted this position and, after carrying out an audit, I reorganized these departments. In addition, since the head office is in Lyons and I live close by, I have surrounded myself with professionals in the Rhône Alpes region (accountant, auditor, administrative manager, banker and lawyer) to be able, thanks to their professionalism and our proximity, to ensure peace of mind in these areas for the association.

ADAPTING TO COVID-19

During the Covid-19 pandemic, we were obliged to stop our extra-curricular courses at ANAK's centers but we were able to resume them in October 2021 to the delight of the children. On the program: reading, Balinese dance, English and computing. And this was all done while following the health protocols in place: wearing a mask, washing hands, respecting distancing. The study tour and six-month medical check-ups will resume in 2022.

In July and August 2021, we were also obliged to cancel the monthly distribution due to government PPKM (activity limitation) rules and to Covid-19 cases existing in Pakisan, Sawan and Galungan. Three of our children's families had Covid-19 (1 in Pakisan, 2 in Sawan) but they recovered. The president of ANAK Bali went into the field to give our coordinators pocket money and gifts for the children; the coordinators then delivered them. We were able to resume distributions in September 2021.



Thanks to our partner **Bali Autrement** and its “reservations during Covid” program, as well as the online kitty we mentioned in our previous newsletter, we were able to continue to distribute food staples. After distributing more than 11 tons of rice, 815 dozen eggs, 713 liters of oil and 366 bars of soap in 2020, we helped the neediest families during the most difficult months (March and April) in 2021. Then in October, thanks to a donation from the **Sainte Marie - La Réunion Rotary Club**, we were able to distribute food staples to all families. In 2021, therefore, we donated over four tons of rice, 281 dozen eggs and 275 liters of oil. We hope to continue providing this type of assistance in 2022 and are counting on your help. Please talk about ANAK with the people around you.



In October 2021, after a year and a half of distance learning, all schools in Bali reopened. We were therefore able to bring all the high school students to the Dharma Citta 2 residence so that they could attend their high schools twice a week for a two-hour teaching session (there is a limit on the number of students per class), and start participating in activities once again. As soon as they arrived at the residence, we organized training with the help of a professional nurse to provide antigenic tests independently on site. It is a test they do every month. Now all high school students have been vaccinated. In fact, all school children who are old enough (12 and up) have received the vaccine. Moreover, all our coordinators have been vaccinated with the exception of Ciwik who is waiting for news from his village.



GETTING INVOLVED - PROJECTS IN EUROPE

Annual General Meeting (AGM) of ANAK Switzerland

ANAK Switzerland's AGM took place in Geneva on April 24, 2021 via a videoconference at which Maya and Dwi were present. We reviewed the 2020 accounts and the 2021 projects and voted on the 2021 budget. A new Board was elected and has five members. Nathalie was elected Treasurer at this AGM. This virtual AGM allowed for friendly conversation among the members present and the Balinese team. The next AGM will take place in Geneva in April 2022—in person, we hope.



ANAK Luxembourg's AGM

ANAK Luxembourg's AGM was held on February 27, 2021 via videoconference. The President welcomed all participants and made a speech in which he thanked all members and friends for their commitment and active support during the year, which was, unfortunately, once again strongly impacted by the coronavirus pandemic. He highlighted the success of our end-of-year chocolate sale and the decision to sponsor 10 new children. As a result, ANAK Luxembourg will sponsor 15 children in addition to 10 private godparents. Since ANAK Luxembourg is beginning its third financial year, it will be able to submit a request to the Luxembourg government for NGO accreditation. A presentation of the activity report, the financial report and the auditors' report followed, as did a discussion on activities planned for 2021.

Two AGMs for ANAK France in 2021

An Ordinary General Meeting (OGM) for ANAK France took place on March 20, 2021 via videoconference given the health crisis. This decision was once again

very popular among our members. In fact, more than 29 people connected and actively participated in the OGM. Two members of our Balinese team were once again able to respond live to all questions from our members and godparents. We reviewed the 2020 accounts, voted on the 2021 budget and elected new members to the Board of Directors and the office. All projects for 2021 were

reviewed in detail and voted on unanimously. Mrs. Sylvie Castro was elected Treasurer for ANAK France. Corine Dupont and François Giry joined the Board of Directors on this occasion. This virtual OGM enabled friendly conversations to take place among the members present and the Balinese team. We plan to organize the next AGM in person in March 2022 but also by videoconference given the success of the 2020 and 2021 AGMs.

On November 20, 2021, an Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM) took place again via videoconference in view of the continuing health crisis. The two-fold purpose of this EGM was to modify our by-laws and confirm the choice of the Auditor and Deputy Auditor for a period of six years according to French law. All proposals presented were approved by all participants.

Sale of Second-hand Books in Geneva

Nathalie and Christine, Swiss godmothers and members of the ANAK Switzerland Committee, organized a second-hand book sale on Saturday, November 20, 2021 at Plan-Les-Ouates, in the region of Geneva.

Several people also purchased ANAK pencils during this event.

All of the money collected was donated to our association so that new books could be purchased for the libraries at our various centers.

This operation was a great success and many people learned about our association, our godparenting possibilities and our projects



A Communications Volunteer



Justine, a first-year student in a Master's degree program in Organizational Communications at Lyon 2 University, joined our team in the Spring for a two-month end-of-studies internship.

Justine had planned to carry out her internship in Bali in the field with

our teams, however, in view of the health situation she was unable to go. Instead, she worked remotely under the supervision of Florence and in collaboration with our communications team, of which she took charge by reorganizing our paper and digital media and by editing our Spring newsletter. She also contributed to meetings and worked on other marketing and communications projects during this period.

We all enjoyed working with her.

Chocolate Sales at the Christmas Market

ANAK Luxembourg participated in the BGL BNP Paribas Christmas Market on December 3, 2021 and at the



Luxembourg City Christmas Market on December 18, 2021. A private sale also took place at Jean-Marie's home on November 27, 2021. Once again, our chocolate sales were very successful. We sold sachets of chocolates as well as Panettone. The funds raised will allow ANAK Luxembourg to pursue its activities to help children in Bali.

Solidarity Concert of Gongs in Cadaqués

On October 31, 2021, we organized a solidarity concert with Moksha Cadaqués - Reiki workshops, sound and energy techniques. The concert took place in the Meditation Chapel of the Church of Santa María de Cadaqués. Christine Grosso, the founder of ANAK, and several members of the Association attended. The event started with a presentation on ANAK - Aid to Indonesian Children by Griselda Tarres Vila and on Moksha Cadaqués (Aid to the Ao Zora School in India), which was then followed by a concert of gongs, chants and shelltone. We thank the audience of all generations for their radiant presence and for their contribution of wonderful energy from the heart, which created the best atmosphere possible. Our actions may seem like a drop in the ocean but they are so important for the children we help and they make the world a better place.

My name is **Nico**. I was born in France but have lived abroad since I was 18. I have spent most of my adult life in Indonesia. I have been working for 18 years teaching and guiding scuba diving.... In September 2021, Christine met my mother and told her about ANAK Bali. My mother then told me about it and we decided I could help by doing something to give back to the community. As a result, I went to Amed to meet the ANAK Bali team and started sharing some of my knowledge about English as well as sustainability and recycling with the children of ANAK Bali. Dear godparents,

Correspondence by mail is a way for godparents to establish a link with their godchildren. You write to them, they write to you; Mantra and Sesilia translate! To make things easier, we suggest you use the e-mail address provided for this purpose:

malettreatanak@yahoo.com. You can scan your handwritten letter and attach it if you wish. Your letter with its translation plus postcards, T-shirts and other small gifts arriving by mail or via visiting godparents will be passed on to the child. Thank you, everyone! As of this year, the teenagers at our Dharma Citta residence all have a personal email address. This means you can e-mail them directly as long as it is in English and that we are always copied. If you would like to receive their address and help your godchildren improve their English, contact us!

GOOD TO KNOW: beauty and perfume products as well as medications and electronic devices are taxed at customs up to 50% of their purchase price (the customs agencies get information off the Internet). Therefore, if you would really like to offer this type of product to your godchildren, we suggest you use the “ANAK postman” system rather than send a package.

ACHIEVEMENTS

Online French Course with Sesil



“When godparents come to visit their godchildren, ANAK staff accompany them and facilitate their communication. The language difference is not the main obstacle for godchildren and their godparents, but

it would be nice if godchildren could get to know their godparents directly in French. This is why I decided to offer a French course to ANAK’s teenage godchildren at first. They were unexpectedly very enthusiastic but since the lessons were conducted remotely, some children were forced to withdraw due to internet problems (internet is not affordable and quotas are insufficient).

The learning focused on "introducing yourself" and Jean-Luc, an ANAK volunteer from France who joined the course, was able to help the children practice pronunciation directly as a native speaker. At the end of the course, the godchildren made a very creative video presentation in French. You can watch it on our Facebook page.

Surya, Winner of "Miss High School-Bali"

Surya, a student from Pakisan in the second year of high school is this year's winner of an inter-high school multi-talent competition organized in Bali ("JEJEG BAGUS BALI," which is similar in French to "Miss High School Bali and Mister High School Bali"). After the final competition at her high school (14 boys and girls were finalists out of the 50 selected), she will be able to participate in the regional competition (Buleleng). She has been accompanied throughout the trials by Sindi, an ANAK high school student who competed last year and is one of this year's coaches. Surya is very happy and proud of this victory because it enabled her to gain confidence in herself. It not only made the high school students sponsored by ANAK proud but also, in a more general way, the association itself.



Her three co-godparents and the association wish her good luck and have no doubt that this experience will delight her family and inspire the younger children in the association.

ACHIEVEMENTS

Mini Projects for Primary and Middle School Students

During the last Bali team seminar, we became aware that since the children no longer have school on site, nor are they able to participate in extracurricular activities with the association (it has been more than 10 months due to the Covid-19 pandemic), they have lost their motivation to study and no longer have the opportunity to practice their talents. To remedy this, we offered children mini projects for creative and manual activities, such as making flower pots from used fabrics, spoons from coconuts, plates or baskets from bamboo, and also learn other basic skills such as cooking, singing, sewing, etc.

As a result, the children had a month and a half to carry out an activity and take a photo or video under the guidance of the ANAK coordinator in their village. The children took part in the challenge and made some very beautiful objects, some delicious cakes and shared their talents. In this way, they were able to develop their creativity, their critical thinking, their attitude and their ability to collaborate and communicate. They were able to keep their achievements at home and share them with their families in the hope that this exercise would also motivate other children around them.



Graduation Diplomas

This year, three ANAK-sponsored university students completed their studies in Civil Engineering (Agus Tirta), International Business Management (Suardana), and Hospitality and Tourism Management (Asriani). Like last year's graduates, they are still experiencing difficulties in finding work straight after graduation, but they are actively seeking. Asriani is considering looking for her first job abroad. Although once again this year our team in Bali was unable to attend their graduation ceremony (a small committee ceremony due to social distancing), we are proud of Agus, Suardana and Asriani, of their tenacity and success, and hope they will be models of inspiration for the association's high school students who are starting to think seriously about the possibilities available to them.



Young People Moving Abroad

With the Covid-19 pandemic having hit Bali's economy hard in 2021, it is very difficult to find work on the island. Several high school students who graduated in 2020 and 2021 have therefore decided to look for work abroad thanks to a placement agency system that is helping them with the procedure and which advances them money for the costs involved. In relation to this, two young people are currently working in Turkey at massage and spa salons (a two-year contract). Four young people wishing to go to Dubai or Japan are still in the preparation phase for departure or awaiting authorization to travel due to the restrictions in place because of the Covid-19 pandemic.



SAYA SUDAH JADI (what I have become)

Let me introduce myself. My name is Kadek Nita Pebriani. I am 23 years old. I am from the village of Galungan. I became a godchild in grade 5 of primary school.

At the beginning, I did not understand why ANAK sponsored me. However, when the ANAK team in Galungan explained it to me, I then understood. It's true that at that time my family was having economic difficulties. We lived in a bamboo house. I am grateful to ANAK because it helped me continue my studies up until high school. I remember when I was in the 6th year of primary school, my father used to tell me "you'll only finish primary school." I explained to him that ANAK was offering to pay for my schooling. And ... I finished vocational high school. During my sponsorship, I received help in several forms: school supplies, pocket money, school uniforms. I also took extra-curricular courses organized by the association at the center. I took lessons in reading, computing, English and Balinese dance.

After completing my sponsorship through ANAK, I worked for one year at a hotel in Nusa Dua. Then I decided to quit because I wanted to focus on selling clothes online (which I still do now, thanks to my Facebook and Instagram pages). This year I started donating to the association because it is my dream. When I was in middle school, I told myself that one day I would help the association as soon as I had a job. And here I am today: I work as an online salesperson and I am living my dream.

I hope that ANAK in the future will be able to help more and more children in their schooling.

Luh Nila Irmayanti is from Galungan. She became a godchild in 2012 when she was in grade 2 at primary school. She is currently living at the Dharma Citta 2 home in Singaraja and is in the third year of general high school. She hopes to continue to university and study accounting.

I Nyoman Purnata is from Datas. He became a godchild in 2011 when he was in grade 3 of primary school. He was at the Dharma Citta home in Singaraja for three years during his studies at the professional cooking school. He is now at Jimbaran University (Politeknik Negeri Bali) in the "Business Administration" section.

Ni Made Wipra Ranum Ratna Ayu is from Pakisan. She became a godchild in 2012 when she was in grade 3 of primary school. She is currently at the Dharma Citta 2 home in Singaraja in her third year of general high school and would like to continue her studies in Psychology.

I Made Kutang is from Amed. He became a godchild in 2012 when he was in grade 4 of primary school. He was at the Dharma Citta Home in Singaraja for three years while he was studying woodcarving. He is now at Jemberana Maritime University in the "Merchant Marine" section.

MEETINGS - GODPARENTS' TESTIMONIALS

It is now seven years since we first met ANAK Bali and the children of Bali.

First came our discovery, then our pleasure and now our certainty of having made a good decision to meet with the association, with Putri and with all these children from very poor backgrounds.

We found out about ANAK Bali via the internet. When we arrived in Bali, the office made it easy for us to meet the children and coordinators at the various centers during a distribution tour ...

We met Putri and her grandmother at their small house and encountered the modesty and generosity of these people who have nothing. At each meeting, we had to learn to communicate with smiles, gestures and somewhat awkward words, and in doing so we adapted, thereby discovering and surprising ourselves.

What surprised us the most was how mature these children were in taking care of the weakest and the youngest, by offering them their spontaneous, sincere and joyful help. We felt far away from our own teenagers in France who are so spoiled.



We went to all the centers and we have returned every year, meeting with Putri and other children who are learning their culture through the extra-curricular activities offered by the association. What a pleasure it is seeing them grow, emerging from a dirt floor in the middle of nowhere and opening up to a larger vision of the world. The association not only offers them the opportunity to learn but also the framework in which they can become fulfilled young adults with their lives in front of them.

Our son has also signed up and is the godfather of a young student, Ayu, who started university this year. Putri is a resident at Dharma Citta 2 and will finish her studies in aesthetics in May. She has a very mature vision of her future work. We are very happy to have met her and thank her for her generosity, her enthusiasm and her happiness, which also makes us happy.

This human adventure does not stop with her. We created links with her and the entire ANAK family who made this meeting and all the others possible. We will continue to follow Putri in her life experience as well as those of all the children of the association as they experience beautiful, new encounters.

It was in October 2019 that I met I Ketut Artiana, a tall, 16-year-old boy from Amed who, with the help of his classmates, gave us a very warm welcome. Artiana and I then sat down on a staircase to chat. We mixed English and Bahasa, telling each other our respective stories, where we had lived, our passions, our favorite sports and our professional projects. As the end of the day approached, we had to leave Dharma Citta 1. Artiana and his friend kindly drove us back by scooter so that we could enjoy being together up until the very last moment.

The next day, we had scheduled to meet my second godson, Déni. As we weren't expected by Déni and his parents until 10:00 a.m., we had time to do some shopping at the village grocery store. Arriving from the hill above, I could already see his family waiting for us on their terrace. My first reaction was surprise! Déni was taller than in the photos I had of him. Moved, our shy smiles were our first communication. His mother kindly invited us to sit on the terrace and we started by sharing some small gifts and a few basic groceries. We chatted together for nearly two hours, without of course forgetting to taste the small dishes that had been arranged on the table. His parents talked to me about their difficult daily lives and their various activities. This moved me deeply since

I too was of Indonesian origin and some of my family were living under the same conditions. Déni took the opportunity to show me around his very modest home and its surroundings. In his room, he timidly confided to me his desire to become a veterinarian and his passion for nature. He bravely did not hide from me the precarious conditions under which he was studying and was grateful for the help provided by ANAK.

At the beginning of March 2021, a tragic event happened for Déni and his family. Landslides swept their home away. Since I was informed fairly quickly by ANAK, I decided to set up a kitty to reconstruct their home. With the assistance of other ANAK godparents, I was able to post my appeal on the Facebook page. I had the opportunity to obtain help from friends, my parents and the Indonesian association in New Caledonia. Two months later, I was able to raise enough money to build a new house that was stronger to combat future inclement weather. During the following months, Gusti regularly sent me updates on the progress of the work. The house was gradually taking shape.

On October 6, 2021, a date that is personally symbolic to me, the house received a blessing ceremony. Happy and relieved, I look forward to returning to visit Déni and his parents.

I will end this brief testimony with a big thank you to everyone for your encouragement and your help in rebuilding Déni's house, as well as the entire ANAK team for enabling me to meet my godchildren and to share this great adventure with you.

GETTING INVOLVED - PROJECTS IN BALI

A Battle for Dewi's Education

At the end of the 2021 school year, our team in Bali learned that a motivated young girl in the last year of middle school was thinking of stopping her education because her grandfather, who is raising her, refused to allow her to continue her studies at high school. Yet Dewi really wanted to keep on learning.

Knowing this, Dwi (president of ANAK Bali) contacted the government's child protection organization, the Singaraja social department and the village chief to arrange a meeting with Dewi's grandfather. In this way, they were able to explain to him about children's rights to an education and the importance of higher education. Despite this meeting, her grandfather did not change his mind because it was more convenient for him if she stayed at home and helped him with all the daily tasks.

During the July 2021 distribution, Dwi spoke with Dewi again, assuring her that ANAK would welcome her if she wished to continue her studies and go and live at the high school student residence. So, thanks to the unfailing support of ANAK and Dewi's friends who are also ANAK godchildren, Dewi finally came to live at the Dharma Citta 2 residence in Singaraja under the supervision of her village chief.

Since then, her grandfather, who has been talked to by members of his community at village meetings, has finally understood that education is very important for his granddaughter's future and he is happy for her. Dewi goes to visit her grandfather from time to time. We wish her success in her education, which is her dream!

Children's Health



In 2021, the association was unable to set up its semi-annual medical visits for the children (what we call "Medical Check-Ups") due to restrictions linked to the Covid-19 pandemic. However, the children still received soap, toothpaste and toothbrushes. Thanks to the support of ANAK godparents, the association was able to contribute financially to the surgical costs of

a child (appendicitis), dental care for two children, as well as ancillary costs related to the hospitalization of one child and/or one of the parents of two families. The association also supported the families of two children by participating in the costs of a traditional cremation ceremony following the death of their father.





Village Garbage Collection Continues.

Once again distancing rules this year did not allow us to offer any extra-curricular activities at ANAK's centers. However, it was possible to continue outdoor activities as long as distancing rules were respected. Therefore, the children were happily able to continue collecting waste in their villages and work toward a cleaner village and protecting the Planet.

Lila Cita Amed Renovations.

After part of the ceiling on the ground floor almost collapsed due to termites, we renovated the ground floor. We took the opportunity to change the damaged planks on the first floor and install tiles. In this way, we prevented rainwater from entering into the concrete and creating water leaks on the ground floor. Furthermore, the area where the children carry out their activities was repainted.

During this work, we also installed a window in one of the two upstairs bedrooms to allow more light to enter and to improve ventilation.



Projects Carried Out Thanks to Godparents.

The support of ANAK's godparents goes well beyond monthly sponsorship. In fact, godfathers and/or godmothers are members of the family with whom the children correspond and which supports them throughout their schooling. In addition to sponsorship, godparents are able to finance projects to meet the needs of the family and/or their godchild. This year, we were able to finance the dental care of Sindi, a student in her final year of high school (by installing posts on her front teeth); install pipes at the home of Mertiani in Panji Anom so that his family could have running water at home; install a rainwater collection cistern for Popi and Reni so that this large family of 18 members would have water during the dry season; and even rebuild the house of a middle school boy in Galungan destroyed by landslides. We are proud to be able to work together to improve the daily lives of our godchildren and their families. We sincerely thank the godparents without whom this support would not be possible.

"We are Mathilde and Théophile and after getting married in July 2020 ... we took a one-year sabbatical to travel the world and carry out a project with an association in Indonesia, our favorite country.

After a few twists and turns, we discovered ANAK thanks to Bali Autrement. After spending our quarantine in Jakarta, we established ourselves in Seminyak before meeting Maya for the first time. Due to her overflowing generosity and unfailing naturalness, we immediately felt welcomed into this big family where we would spend the next six months. Due to our knowledge about communication, we were tasked with producing videos to highlight the tremendous daily work of the Balinese teams: Dwi, Sus, Gusti, Maya and the coordinators. We went to meet godchildren and young people, and entered into the intimacy of families to capture the reality of their life, which is far removed from the paradisiacal image of the island of the gods in the eyes of the world.

As a result of this quest for adventure and due to the humble and beautiful encounters we have experienced, we have matured and wish to continue our commitment. We became members and hope to become ANAK godparents very soon. Mathilde has offered to run ANAK's social networks on a voluntary basis until December 2021 as she develops a business creation

project linked to associations' communications.

A Car for Panji Anom.

The village of Panji Anom does not have an ANAK center yet and the team is struggling to organize extra-curricular activities there. The children are very happy to be able to resume their extra-curricular activities!

Every We're.

This year, the members of Every We're shared their energy with ANAK on a project to install new computers at the Amed, Sawan and Pakisan centers. “Every We're is a social start-up. It brings together a dream team focused on impact projects to solve problems of general interest, placing people and the planet at the center of reflection ... on three main axes: education, food and social, all in an approach that is as eco-responsible as possible. It is in the context of Every We're's 'Social Incubator' intervention hub that ANAK has received support for its project to finance computers for the children. The Every We're team is looking after the communications campaign, canvassing partners and raising funds to ensure financing of these computers by organizing awareness events (live Instagram, sports sessions, etc.).” (Extract from their website: <https://everywere.org>).

Rotary Clubs on Our Side.

We would like to thank four Rotary clubs (Rotary Club of Honolulu, Sainte Marie-La Réunion Rotary Club, Horizon Luxembourg Rotary Club and Rotary Club of Lyons) for supporting us this year in our Dharma Citta 2 construction projects, the distribution of food staples, and the purchase of a vehicle so that children in Panji Anom are able to participate in activities. We hope that other Rotary clubs will come and help us with new projects for 2022 and the years to come so that we can continue to help children and make their dreams come true.





Dharma Citta 2 Finished after Four Years of Work !

In 2017, we prepared for the construction of the Dharma Citta 2 center, a two-story residence to accommodate a maximum of 64 high school students. We mentioned it in our previous newsletters in order to share with you this gigantic project costing more than 200,000 euros. This year, thanks to the many donations and the support received, we laid the final stone of the building, but we have not completely finished developing it. We are happy and grateful to all the Patrons, Donors and Members of ANAK's Team for their tireless work in making such a project happen. Since October 2021, a total of 50 people have resided there (45 high school students, 3 middle school students, Ketut, the coordinator, and Ibu Sami, the manager). The teenagers are well installed and are able to devote themselves to their studies still partially on site at the end of the year. It is also in this context that we provided tablets to all high school students (included in their sponsorship) so they can do their homework and have online classes with their teachers.



A New Center in Pacung Village.

After Sawan village in 2017, it was Pacung village's turn to have an ANAK center so that godchildren and village children could have a place where they could participate in extra-curricular activities organized by ANAK. Thanks to Ciwik, an ANAK coordinator, the generosity of the village chief who has lent us the land for an indefinite period, that of a donor, Mrs. Zamora, and the support of the LMAC company, we were able to build this pretty center by the sea with easy access for the children. We are currently still looking for funds to include a computer room, which we hope to be able to set up in January 2022.

Raja Foundation's "Coup de Cœur" Award.

The Raja Foundation has been supporting ANAK since 2018 and, thanks to it, great achievements have been made. This year the Raja Foundation is celebrating its 15th anniversary and has set up a "Coup de Cœur" award. This prize was awarded by employees of the RAJA Group, its customers and suppliers as the result of an online vote. Six projects were selected from among the winning projects of the "RAJA people" prizes, organized every year between 2018 and 2020 by the RAJA-Danièle Marcovici Foundation. Thanks to active support for our project presented by our godmother Borbala, an employee of the Raja group, we were awarded this prize, which will allow us to continue our activities with the girls at the Dharma Citta 2 residence.

The awards ceremony took place on November 16, 2021 at the Théâtre du Trianon in Paris and Florence and Jean-Luc were present at this event to receive this "Coup de Cœur" award.



The RAJA-Danièle Marcovici Foundation

(<https://www.fondation-raja-marcovici.com>) was created in 2006 at the initiative of Danièle Kapel Marcovici, CEO of the RAJA Group, and supports projects to empower women.

The Foundation carries out awareness-raising activities on the cause of women among various types of groups. It shares its expertise and encourages the exchange of experience based on the results of the projects it supports to improve the effectiveness of actions in the field and help scale up the lessons learned. To do this, it sets up partnerships with other foundations, with stakeholders in the financial sector and with those at institutions.

It financially supports projects in four areas:

- ✧ Fighting violence against women and children
- ✧ Promoting women's education and leadership
- ✧ Supporting professional integration and women's economic rights
- ✧ Working for climate justice and women's actions

GETTING INVOLVED - DONATIONS

This year once again we were able to distribute 40 towels to ANAK's children thanks to **Isabelle**, an ANAK godmother, and her on-site Balinese friend who came to bring them to us. The children were delighted because a towel represents an expense for families of the godchildren.

Thanks to Sandrine, our volunteer in Bali, and **Mr. Guironnet** (General Manager), in November 2021 we also received 250 towels in very good condition from the **Apurva Kempinski Bali** hotel. These will be given to children in December. In February, we were able to distribute cookies to all the children thanks to a donation from **SOS Bali** (Scholars of Sustenance) and their volunteers **Putra** and **Dominique**, who is an ANAK godfather living in Bali.



An Author with a Big Heart.

Claire Zamora, novelist, screenwriter and creator of video games, discovered ANAK Aid to Indonesian



Children during her research work when writing her novel "Le bonheur était là" (Happiness was there) published in March 2021 by Hugo Roman. The heroes of her story decide to leave their lives in Paris and travel to the other side of the world to help a school destroyed by a tsunami. It's a story

that ends in Bali and talks about making dreams come true, friendship, courage and openness to others. Moved by our association and by its actions, Claire decided to support us in a major project: the construction of the new center in Pacung (Tejakula). ANAK and the children would like to thank Claire for her generous contribution to this project.



A Crowdfunding fundraiser Before Visiting.

Two students, **Capucine** and **Théo**, wish to take advantage of their road trip to Bali scheduled for July 2022 to help our association. Their aim is to provide the children with books and, if the amount is sufficient, a printer for Dharma Citta's high school students' residence in northern Bali. They will bring their gifts on site when they spend a day with our team and the children of the association. Livestock for Families of Godchildren.

This year, a few children and their families also received financial assistance to buy goats. These families chose to keep goats because it is easy to feed them (they easily find foliage around their house) and goat dung can be used as fertilizer. In addition, once a family owns several goats, they can sell some of them to improve their income. If you would like to help a family by purchasing livestock for them, please contact our team in Bali first so that they can check whether your godchild's family needs goats and if their situation allows them to raise livestock.



Desks for Our Godchildren.

Those of you who have visited Bali know that the Balinese, whatever their activity, are rarely seated. However, at the end of 2020, after seeing that many of the children were doing their homework on the ground, or on plastic crates, we decided to provide them with small tables so they could work under better conditions. With the help of kitties and especially the assistance of our godmothers and godfathers who were able to provide it, the majority of children have now received them. And as they are made in Bali and, where possible, by families of godchildren, it kills two birds with one stone!

It's a good idea to keep in mind!

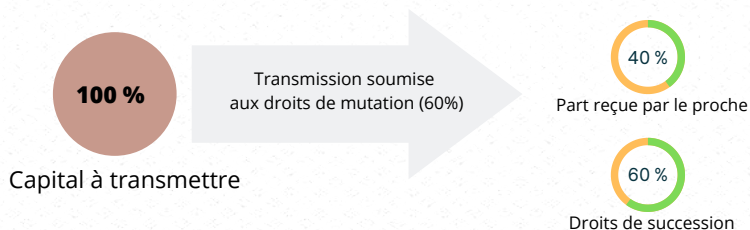
Bequests, Another Way to Give

Our association, which was recognized as an NGO of public interest on January 1, 2006, is authorized to receive donations and bequests.
