## Our secretary in Bali

ello, my name is Gousti. I joined the ANAK team in 2013 after working as a French-speaking guide for the Bali Autrement agency.

At the time, I accompanied travelers and introduced them to the association's work in Pakisan. I was thrilled to join ANAK Bali, because humanitarian commitment to the children in my community is very important to me. It's been almost 10 years that I have been translating letters from sponsors in Bahasa Indonesian and then the responses from their sponsored children in French. I also ensure the link for gifts (Christmas, birthday, school success, etc.) that sponsors wish to offer. I work closely with village coordinators to find gifts that have meaning for the children and their families. I also organize visits for sponsors when they want to meet their sponsored children during a trip to Bali. I participate in the monthly distributions: I help the children answer letters from their sponsors and I do singing activities with them. I encourage them in their studies so they don't miss the opportunities offered by their support. I am very happy to work for disadvantaged children and so happy to see them find work when they become adults.

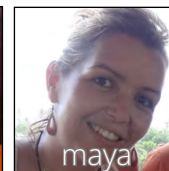
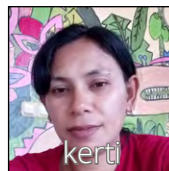
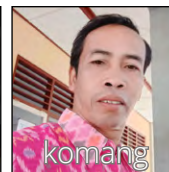


## A Digital Communication Team

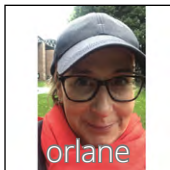

# TAKING PART

## **GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF ANAK FRANCE**

The 26th of March 2022, the Ordinary General Assembly of Anak France was held via videoconference due to the health situation. This solution was once again a great success among our members. In fact, over 30 people connected and actively participated in the OGA. Two members of our Balinese team were able to answer live to all the questions from our members and sponsors. Our accountant and auditor were also present on this occasion. We reviewed the 2021 accounts, voted on the 2022 budget, and elected the new Board of Directors and the Executive Committee. Each 2022 project was reviewed in detail and was voted unanimously.

This virtual AG allowed for a friendly exchange between all connected members and the Balinese team. We are considering organizing the next GA in person in March 2023 but also via videoconference given the success of previous GAs.



## **GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF ANAK SWITZERLAND**

On April 9, 2022, the General Assembly of Anak Switzerland took place in Geneva both in person and through videoconference, with Maya and Dwi present.

We reviewed the accounts of 2021, the projects of 2022 and voted on the budget for 2022. The Committee was reelected and has 5 members.

This General Assembly allowed for a friendly exchange between the members present and the Balinese team. The next General Assembly will take place in Geneva in April 2023, both in person and through videoconference, due to the success of previous assemblies.

## **GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF ANAK LUXEMBOURG**

The 4th general assembly of the ANAK Luxembourg ASBL took place by teleconference on April 4, 2022. A budget was allocated to the dedicated funds to finance sponsorships and the "Bridge" project to support employment for children who have completed their studies and are struggling to enter the job market. The general assembly gave a discharge for the activity report and the cash report. The Board of Directors was also given a discharge for their work.



## Charity Evening in Lyon

On May 25th, 2022, Jérôme and Laurence (and their entire team from the "Le Petit Meunier" Restaurant in Messimy, near Lyon) rallied to organize a Balinese-themed charity evening: on the agenda was a cocktail dinner, Indonesian dances, and a sale of Balinese goodies. It was also an opportunity to meet the co-founder of the association, Christine Grosso, our Partnership Manager Mabé, and exchange with Maya about our on-the-ground projects. A successful evening that, thanks to the generosity of all, allowed for the funding of the 2022 extracurricular activities of our 6 socio-cultural centers and for sponsoring, co-sponsoring four of the young people in the ANAK program! Thank you very much to Jérôme and Laurence, always there to help ANAK.

## Sale of Second-hand Books in Geneva

Nathalie and Orlane, Swiss godmothers and members of the ANAK Switzerland Committee, organized a used book sale on Saturday, December 3, 2022 in Plan-Les-Ouates, in the Geneva region. The entire amount collected, 800 Swiss francs (about 800 €), was fully donated to our association to finance the after-school activities of the children. This operation was very successful and many people discovered our association, our sponsorships, and our projects.



## Anak under the banners



As every year, the Festival of Banners was held in Lyon. This year, on September 17, thirty countries were represented including Indonesia.

Nyoman Mans and his children as well as Wakinah Purnama were part of the delegation. They spoke about their culture, their language and also about our ANAK association with the help of a small stand. They distributed our brochures and explained our actions and answered the questions of visitors. A parade in traditional costumes and dances delighted the spectators.

## Chocolate Sale at Christmas Market

The 4th chocolate sale was organized in 2022. ANAK Luxembourg participated in the Christmas markets of Lalux Assurance (11/24), the City of Mersch (11/25 and 11/26), the City of Luxembourg (12/03), the City of Grevenmacher (12/10 and 12/11), and BNP BGL Paribas (12/14). Our chocolate sale was once again a great success. We sold packets of chocolate and chestnuts, advent calendars, bottles of wine "LES RÊVES" and Panettone. The funds collected will allow ANAK Luxembourg to actively continue its support activities for children in Indonesia and contribute to realizing their dreams.

## Puberty and menstrual hygiene education

In 2022, 130 young girls are sponsored and about 75 are over 12 years old. Addressing with them the questions related to their menstruation will improve their knowledge about puberty, menstruation and generally raise awareness of the risks and consequences of early and unwanted pregnancies. These subjects are important, especially in Indonesia where access to this information is not easy and communication on this subject is still taboo. 2022 is the year of setting up the program: assessing needs, purchasing and delivering sustainable and eco-responsible protection to Bali. Katia Turnier, Head of School of the French High School in Bali, has offered us the support of Dinda, a nurse at the LFB, to build informative workshops for the adolescents, in Indonesian and taking into account the specificities of the Balinese community.

Sri Murtiasih, a former godchild, nurse in Singaraja, and Sujana, a godchild in the last year of nursing course, have agreed to co-animate the future workshops. 2023 will be the year of launching the awareness workshops. Thanks to the Raja Daniele Marcovici Foundation and the Elson collective for their financial support.

Thanks to **Katia Turnier** and **Dinda** from the French High School in Bali for their help in setting up the workshops.



In 2022, Anak was able to successfully carry out projects planned during the Covid years. We are therefore happy to have welcomed for a week the 12 teenagers and 4 supervisors from the **Bulleurs de Zola** (see article in bulletin 29) who allowed the children from Amed to discover snorkeling for four afternoons. Then, they had a weekend at Dharma Cita to allow for an exchange between the Balinese and French youth. Their generosity and care for the children was fantastic. We express our warmest thanks to them and look forward to welcoming the new group in 2023 or 2024.



Thanks to Instagram, we were able to meet the **Miljian** family. This French-Italian couple, lives in Bali with their 3 children, and came to visit us at the office first, then we showed them the life of the DC2 home and the actions of our association. Following this wonderful encounter, the Miljian family was able to share their social media visibility with us and we are in contact for a future project.





## The Rotary Club of Honolulu

Building on a partnership that began three years ago prior to the COVID 19 Pandemic, 21 Rotarians family members and friends travelled in late October 2022 to Bali from Hawaii and mainland USA to participate in an International Service Project.

The participants, ranging in age from nine to eighty-two years, over 5 days helped build the organic farm elements that sit adjacent to the Dharma Cita (DC) Dormitory in Singaraja.[...] The focal farm activity for the Rotarian group was the construction of a perimeter wall that will provide security for the site part of which will be used for motorbike storage freeing the dormitory courtyard for other uses. [...] Arriving for their first workday on 31 October (Halloween) they brought costumes decorations and candy to introduce the children and staff to the American traditions that have grown around the celebration of this Christian Holy day. A candy filled pumpkin piñata suspended with a rope held by two Rotarians delighted the students who roared with laughter as those who volunteered to be blindfolded and try to puncture the piñata with a wooden stick swung at it it vigorously as it moved erratically. The children's first exposure to this American holiday tradition will likely not be the last as decorations and costumes brought to celebrate it will be stored and perhaps used next Halloween..

Throughout the rest of the week Rotary project participants provided after school instruction in; computer training in document creation and manipulation using Microsoft Office, English language conversational classes, and several popular line dances. Over the past two years, the Rotary Club of Honolulu provided nearly \$45k USD funding for the construction completion of DC, the construction of the organic farm, and the provision of electric Motor Bikes,





computers and other materials all benefiting the students of ANAK's Dharma Cita.

Although the participants over their 5 days in Singaraja took great satisfaction in the labors in the garden and the perimeter wall construction, their greatest satisfaction was interacting with the students whose effervescent personalities, beautiful smiles and irrepressible curiosity endeared them to each of the participants, several of whom will in the future sponsor students through ANAK. The project week culminated with a delicious dinner prepared by the students of DC and included entertainment of dance and song. Following the presentation by the students The Rotary project participants gave a presentation about Hawaiian culture and dance. Sad farewells on 4 November were coupled with promises to return for possible future projects and interaction with the staff and students of ANAK.

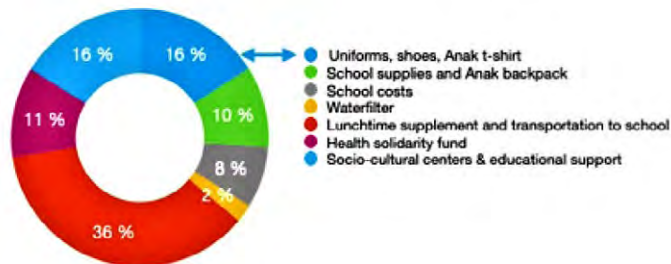

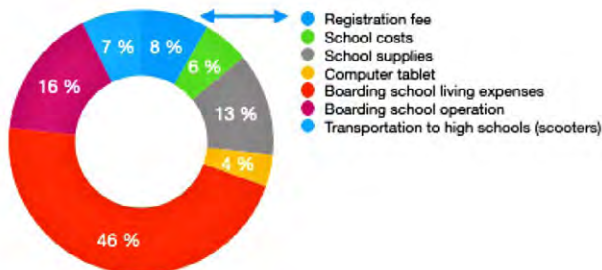

## Sponsors' visit to their sponsored children

After 2 years of absence of sponsors and visitors due to Covid-19, this year, 14 sponsors were able to come and visit their sponsored children.

In July, Mita's sponsors came with their children. They visited Mita and her family in Pakisan and took them for a walk on the beach, swimming and lunch together at a warung (local small restaurant), before ending with some shopping in Singaraja.

Among others, we also had Prayoga's sponsor, who is a university student. They met up in Kuta before going together to visit Prayoga's family in his village in the east of Bali. These sponsors met their sponsored child for the first time and were very happy. They also made donations of clothing, stuffed animals, treats, etc.



## A meeting and then a project.



In July, I accompanied ANAK's team during the distribution week before the new school year. It was a wonderful experience! ANAK's team supports the children with their enthusiasm and kindness, promoting a dialogue of trust and forging strong bonds with each of them. In the different centers, I shared precious moments

with both younger and older children. We talked in English, watched presentations of Balinese dancing and singing. It is a chance to support the education of these curious children about life. And my summer experience convinced me to commit to six months of volunteering with the association. We will share our know-how with ANAK's teachers to imagine and set up together, motivating English workshops that match the needs of the children. I am looking forward to meeting the entire ANAK team, children, teenagers and staff soon.

The President of Anak Luxembourg, J.M. Hoffmann, was able to visit the projects in Bali three times this year. During his visit in June, a "Pool Fun Day" with food at Alam Sambangan, Singaraja was organized for the enjoyment of the 25 children sponsored by ANAK Luxembourg. Children from the villages of Panji Anom, Pacung, Pakisan, Sawan, and Galungan were invited to the pool and driven by a car sponsored by the Rotary Club Luxembourg-Horizon in 2021. The children would like to repeat this activity every year.



In 2021, the **Rotary Club Sainte-Marie Roland Garros Centenaire** (based in Réunion) supported the Anak association with exceptional food aid during the COVID-19 pandemic (see bulletin 29 article). In November 2022, I wanted to meet the members of the association and accompany them on their tours of the seven villages. I met an extremely dedicated team in Bali who is invested in its mission to support young people and has immense generosity of heart. Every month, during the distributions, the Bali team is eagerly awaited with great joy. The

children are very grateful and aware of the opportunity they have to be sponsored and thus access schooling and extracurricular teachings. During an official ceremony in Dharma Cita, I presented the flag of our club to the president of Anak Bali. In exchange, I received a beautiful representation of the Anak association symbol. Upon my return to Réunion, I will present it to our President Nathalie. On the evening of the ceremony, I sent the photos to the members of our club. The members of my club are happy with this exchange.

I experienced three days of a strong experience with highly motivated people in their missions. I spoke with the children and young people supported by ANAK; they are extremely endearing and grateful, curious and eager for exchanges in the noble sense of the term. I answered their questions partly in Bahasa Indonesia, partly in English, and in French translated by one of the members of ANAK Bali. I promised to come back and see them on my next trip to Bali.

# ACHIEVEMENTS

## ANAK paints with Léona Rose



In July 2022, the children of Pacung and the teenagers of DC2 had the opportunity to express their creativity on colorful mural frescoes drawn by artist Léona Rose. As part of her trip to Bali, Léona Rose contacted us and offered this multicolored project that excited both our team and the children. Thus, a yoga session, drawing of the fresco (walls of the Pacung and Dharma Cita centers) and coloring by the children allowed us to spend time with Léona whose positive energy radiated during these three afternoons. Laughter and dancing were on the agenda during the painting sessions. A big thank you to Léona for her generosity of spirit and for the markers given that will allow us to continue her project.

## Workshops with Indonesian artists.

Seeds for A Child is a developed program using art therapy with a neo-humanism approach to support childrens' dreams and help them to see the world in wider and colourful perspectives, with the support of different artists who join **LucyDream Gallery** community that teach them different skills every week. Last October and November our program hold place in Anak Association Bali in Desa Sambangan and 2 weeks in Desa Sawan.[...]



The overall experience [...] a beautiful and memorable one, not only an eye-opening experience for the children for all of us. We learned from the children that have amazing, good

energy how loving and caring they were to us. As they have shown us all the positives above, we tried our best to give our utmost to them. We do hope all that we taught them will continue to be developed by the children for their future.

I am massively proud of what they have made, such as; fluorescent paintings with **Hamka Art** and **Skinner Othrami**, embroidery class with **Sherly Noverita**, puppets making with **Puhan Ayu**, Fashion design with **Geofanny Tambunan**, videography with **Taktik Berulah**, drama class by me, **Sisie**, making postcards from recycled paper with **Buan Alit**, and art therapy drawing with **Dayu Santika** and **Mira El Amir**. And all the results were exhibited in our closing ceremony at **Puri Kanginan Buleleng** on our last day of the program, where both of the villages; Sambangan and Sawan were able to collaborate in incredible performance. Sambangan village exhibited what they have made in a 2 weeks period, and Sawan village showed their performance in which they also made their own costumes.[...]

After two years without a Study Tour due to the COVID-19 pandemic, this year, finally, we were able to gather all the children again for a day at the Bedugul botanical garden. In addition to the children, coordinators, teachers, sponsors and godparents of the association came to share this day (223 people in total). After wandering around the park to observe specimens on the spot such as cacti, medicinal plants and tropical trees, the children participated in competitions such as the sack race, the hymn song of each center (created for the occasion) and other games organized by the adolescents of the association, before sharing a picnic together. Despite the rain, the children were delighted to be together, meet each other and share activities all together for a day of laughter and joy.



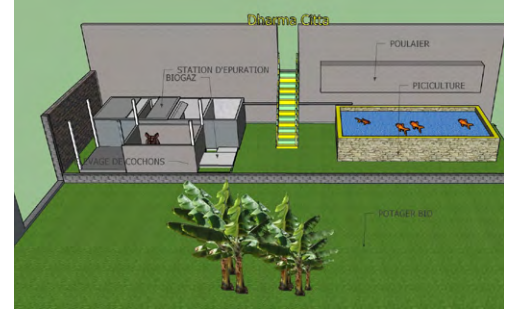


## The organic mini-farm managed by the high school students

Thanks to your generosity (members, supporters and partners), we have launched our organic mini-farm project: an opportunity for the 60 teenagers living at the Dharma Cita dormitory to gain confidence and independence, develop a sense of responsibility and understand environmental issues. Located on a plot of land adjacent to the Dharma Cita boarding school in Singaraja, our mini-farm will have a pen for the raising of 4 pigs, a chicken coop (around 30 laying hens and broiler chickens), a pond with about 50 carp and an organic vegetable garden. We are planning for a more autonomous management of the dormitory:

- Reduction of purchases of basic foodstuffs (pepper, cabbage, tomatoes, etc.) thanks to the harvests of the vegetable garden;
- A small "phytoremediation" station will recycle the gray water from the dormitory to water the garden and provide water for the animals;
- A methanation system (pig manure) will power the dormitory's gas stoves;
- Food waste is recycled to make ecoenzyme soap, very effective for cleaning and environmentally friendly.

Coming from rural families, the teenagers quickly embraced the project. They are being made aware of intelligent and economical water management; they are learning about organic farming and animal husbandry techniques. The teenagers will then be able to share and replicate the approach with their families and villages.





In 2022, all the young people received their high school diploma. 5 young people continued with ANAK among them, 4 continued their studies at the university and one young woman, Arianti, chose to pursue professional training in sewing. This 6-month training with a professional seamstress in Sawan allows her to learn how to make everyday, professional, and traditional Balinese clothing (shirts, skirts, Kebaya, etc.), so she can then open her own workshop in her home region of Karangasem.

Luh Widi, in the Biology field and Ranum in the Information Technology (IT) field, go to Jimbaran University. Luh Widi's biology degree will allow her to work in research, in a medical analysis office, or within the National Agency for Drug and Food Control (BPOM). Ranum, on the other hand, will always find work in this rapidly expanding field here in Bali. The other two university students are in Singaraja, Irma who is in the Management field and Gede Widi who is in Communication Sciences. These two fields will also allow them to find work after graduation. Finally, Sujana has completed her nursing degree and is continuing her studies for an additional year to obtain a management degree, allowing him to later open his own office.

The other high school students who have left the association have found work in different fields, and we wish them great success and will always be happy to welcome them back to the centers so that they can share their experiences with the younger generation.



## SAYA SUDAH JADI (What I have become)



My name is I Gede Oka Prayoga, nicknamed Oka. I am 24 years old and from the village of Bunutan. I was sponsored by the Anak association when I was in first grade and continued until I graduated from the vocational high school in Singaraja. When I was first sponsored, I was surprised. The coordinator came to my home to meet my family and then asked me to come to the Anak center. Since then, I have received help from the association. I am very happy to have received it because without it, I might have only finished my primary education. At the end of primary school, my father was very sick and my family did not have the means to send me further to junior high school. Thanks to Anak's support, I was able to finish junior high school in Bunutan and my vocational high school in Singaraja. I lived for 3 years in the Dharma Citta boarding house for high school students, where I took English classes that are still very useful to me now.

Today I am married, I have a daughter and I work as a driver for tourists. In my job, I continue to use the different tips I received from the association. I hope the Anak association can continue to help many more children from poor families who need help so that they can also realize their dreams. I thank the Anak association very much for its support over the years and because of which I can be what I am now.





**Ni Komang Arianti** is from Bunutan. Her sponsorship began in 2012 when she was in 3rd grade. She lived at the Dharma Citta residence in Singaraja for three years while completing sewing studies at the vocational high school. She is now taking a six-month course to improve her sewing knowledge.

**Kadek Arif Aditya** is from Galungan. His sponsorship began in 2014 when he was in 3rd grade. He lived at the Dharma Citta residence in Singaraja for three years while studying construction at the vocational high school. He is currently taking a training course to be able to work in Japan.

**Luh Putu Meli Ardani** is from Sawan. Her sponsorship began in 2014 when she was in 5th grade. She lived at the Dharma Citta residence in Singaraja for three years while studying at the traditional high school. She's in Colombo right now working at a SPA salon.

**I Nyoman Prayoga** is from Banglé Bunutan. His sponsorship began in 2011 when he was in 3rd grade. He lived at the Dharma Citta residence in Singaraja for three years while studying woodcarving. He is currently at the Polytechnic in Jimbaran studying Business Administration.

"Our love of Bali at first sight dates from 2008 and we return every year (except for the COVID years). We take the opportunity to discover this beautiful country of Indonesia with its traditions, cultures and

varied landscapes.

In 2012, while randomly reading publications at a hotel, we saw an invitation to join ANAK Bali and godparent a child from a family without sufficient means to ensure their education under the best conditions.

We immediately became members committed to supporting this beautiful adventure, in large part convinced by the values and rigor carried out by ANAK.

We have been godparents to Sindi for ten years now and the child we met at the time in Pakisan has become a beautiful young woman who, after completing her studies (SMA), was selected to join a flight attendant training course. We discussed this potential career with Maya and Dwi as it seemed almost natural for us and was her life choice.

Sindi was raised by her grandparents under precarious conditions because they, as day laborers, had only random resources.

ANAK's team had identified a real need in terms of financial aid and external support for Sindi, just as it does for so many other Balinese children. Throughout all these years, we have followed Sindi's progress from primary school to

DC2, with laughter and tears, and every time we meet her, we are always immensely happy to be stakeholders in her growth.

ANAK's presence and action have enabled our goddaughter to open up to other horizons ... and we are certain that Sindi will maintain contact with ANAK and share her experience with future young children joining ANAK.

Strong ties have been forged with Sindi, her family and ANAK, whom we visit every year and whose contact we intend to maintain as long as possible. We will now continue the adventure because we have just offered to godparent a new child whom we look forward to meeting.

Thank you ANAK, your entire team, all field coordinators and volunteers, and thank you to all the children whose smiles and laughter, despite their precarious daily lives, remind us of the true meaning of the word humility. It is an immense privilege for us to take part.

My name is Jeanne Rocco Favier. I am 12 years old, in grade 5, and live near Lyon in France.

I had the opportunity to travel to Bali in the summer of 2019 with my little brother Sacha and my parents.

We then spent two days with the children at the ANAK center (in Pakisan). They were the same age as me, and even though we didn't speak

the same language, I was amazed by their songs, their dances, and the fact that they were very curious about me and my little brother. We even went swimming together at the river, and distributed candy at the end!

They were learning several subjects at the ANAK center and seemed happy and serious.

On my return from this trip, I naturally wanted to have direct contact with a child from Bali. As a result, with my family's support, I became the godmother of Ni Wayan Loliani, who is the same age as me and lives in Bunutan. Loliani also has a little brother; her father is a fisherman, as well as a corn farmer during the rainy season, and her mother takes care of the family.

We write each other several times a year about our respective traditions and our religious holidays, which are so different. I tell her about my holidays, and we talk about daily life. Consequently, I know that Loliani enjoys going to school and would like to be a police officer when she grows up. I find this admirable. As for me, I would love a job where I can help others.

Recently, we were able to help her family a little more: with ANAK's advice, we offered them a beautiful wardrobe,

because they only own a motorcycle, a small house on a small 100m<sup>2</sup> piece of land, and a canoe. They were very happy because they hadn't had a wardrobe before.

One day I would love to go and see her, to get to know her better, and visit her beautiful island of Bali once again.

Last summer, my family and I went to the annual ANAK celebration in France, a few kilometers from Lyon, and I had the chance to talk to Mama Christine and Mabé about my special relationship with Loliani. They were happy and said it was a good idea in fact to put children in direct contact as godparents and godchildren.

It reminded me that there are very different cultures and ways of life among children on Earth. I hope this motivates Loliani. And my parents are even more motivated to support ANAK now.

Mail correspondence is the best way to connect with your godchildren. You write to them, they write to you, Gousti Mantra and Sesilia translate! We suggest you use the email address provided for this purpose: **maletteanak@yahoo.com**. You can scan your handwritten letter and attach it if you wish. It will be sent to the child together with its translation, photos, and any other small gifts you might send by mail or through visiting godparents (the “ANAK postman” system).

ANAK's teenagers all have a personal email address enabling them to correspond directly, provided it's written in English and we are always copied (cc). If you would like to receive your godchildren's addresses and help them improve their English, contact us!

**HINT** :products received by mail are taxed at customs up to 50% of their purchase price (as per customs information on the internet). Consequently, if you really wish to send a gift to your godchildren, we suggest you use the “ANAK postman” system rather than send a parcel.

## **Travels Create/Build Solidarity**

In 2022, the Tour Operator Turquoise set up the YES WE CARE solidarity challenge (2nd Edition). 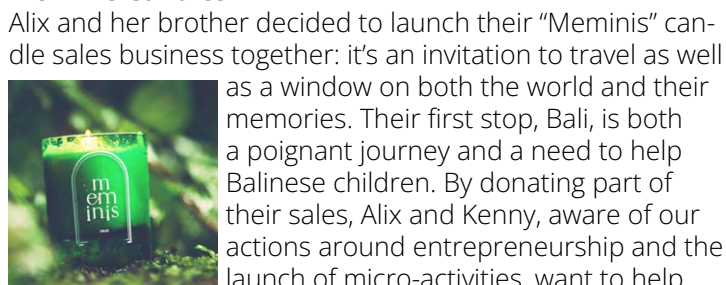
## **Mamoja Jewelry**

## An Interview with Maxime Faure

**ANAK** - When and how did you hear about ANAK?

**Maxime** - I discovered ANAK in 2015 during a trip to Bali. I met Christine Grosso and the Balinese office team at a potato gratin party! I had been disappointed by the south of the island but was happy to travel through the poorer northern regions that were rich in spirituality with their many well maintained temples and wonderful processions. All those daily offerings moved me. After returning to Paris, I immediately became the godfather of a girl with whom I corresponded.

**ANAK** - Why did you decide to become a patron and create a partnership?

**Maxime** - When I was 55, I decided to give my five children a certain sum of money to help them get started in life. I told them that for me there was also "The Child of the World" called ANAK and I wanted to give it the same amount I had given my children. To my great delight, all of them generously approved my idea. Ever since, for about five years now, I have been donating 10,000 euros annually to ANAK.

**ANAK** - Are you satisfied with this partnership and the follow-up?

**Maxime** - Yes! I am completely satisfied. After consulting with ANAK, I participated in the construction of the boarding school residence, the mini organic farm project, and this year, the purchase of musical instruments for the older children. (I am a musician among other things). I also enjoy

supporting the mobile library (a motorcycle with a mini caravan full of books for children and adults) because the idea that books, and with them culture, are delivered to



people makes me happy. Christine has always said, "**Buku adalah jendela dunia**"\*. I like to support ANAK because I trust it and know the sums are well allocated to its projects! In addition, I can truly say that the Universe has returned to me what I have given.

Over time, I have felt that giving and sharing is part of my life learning. Sometimes when "it hurts," we are tempted to do something else ... yet I like consistency. I hope that up until my last breath I can keep giving this amount to

support these children who are thirsty to learn and are not jaded.
